We are undoubtedly seeing an unprecedented revival in the fortunes of the Far-Right throughout whole sections of Europe. The Front National in France have recently taken charge of their fourth major town and similarly in Austria, Italy and Germany to name but a few, the Far-Right seem set to continue to make significant gains.

In Britain, the main fascist party the BNP, may not have the support that the FN's Jean Marie Le Pen can call upon. However with Blair's 'socialist' government now in place and a weak and fragmented Left in danger of disappearing into obscurity, British Fascists are beginning to sense that their time might yet be arriving.

On 5th October anti-fascists in Britain will have the unique opportunity to hear from representatives of the leading militant anti-fascist organisations from throughout Europe and North America who will be giving an outline of fascist activity and anti-fascist resistance in their countries.

The rally will follow the first ever international conference of militant anti-fascists to be held in Britain. The aim of the conference is the formation of an International Network of Militant Anti-Fascists, examining areas of work were we can co-operate, as well as learning from the different experiences in various countries. Those attending the rally will be able to hear a comprehensive report-back from the preceding days events.

Anti-Fascist Action, who is hosting the event, has a record that is second to none in the fight against fascism in Britain. Formed in 1985, AFA is the longest-running anti-fascist organisation in this country, using a unique combination of physical confrontation and ideological struggle that has produced results time and again, culminating in the famous Battle of Waterloo in 1992. The activities of AFA have continued to cause headaches for fascist organisers

and this earned AFA a place on the list of targets for fascist bombs intercepted in Sweden recently.

In Britain we face increasing isolation. We are now attempting to build links with other militants across international borders. We recognise that only by attempting to end the isolation of militants in other countries, can we begin to end our own.
