The nazi misfits exposed in the last issue of Attitude are still around. In this EXCLUSIVE article Leeds AFA identifies a number of local nazis and the pathetic leaders of the so-called 'Leeds C18 Surveillance Section.' If you have any information, or want to get involved, please contact us at the address below.

Kevin Harrison of Richmondfield Lane, Barwick-in-Elmet, sees himself as the leader of the 'Leeds C18 Surveillance section' (ie he's got a car and a camera). He is a sadly fanatical nazi who sees his duty to the 'Master race' as hitting women and attacking City Centre shops. He has a



missing front tooth, often wears glasses and dresses in casual sports clothes. He still uses his White Vauxhall Nova (J551YUB) to ferry nazis about to vandalise shops but is now thought to have left his job as a proofer at Gilchrist Bros Ltd.

Mark 'Sap' Owens lives in Swarcliffe Avenue in Seacroft. Known to anti-fascists across Yorkshire as Monkeyman because of his attractive features, his fellow nazis call him 'Sap'. He has been involved with fascist groups since the 1980's when he was a thuggish member of the NF. Sap works for



Leeds City Council Public Works as a labourer. He drinks regularly in Leeds City Centre with other nazi cronies and organised the BNP meeting at the Staging Post pub in Seacroft several months ago. About 40 nazis from across Yorkshire and Humberside turned up to this meeting which provoked outrage from normal customers who were horrified to see BNP supporters wearing swastikas and listening to nazi band Skrewdriver

Paul 'Floppy' Bennett is a nazi goon from Fairfax Avenue. Drighlington who also enjoys hitting women and has been involved in a number of attacks in Leeds City Centre and at the University (see inside p.4). He used to work in a Next warehouse but is now thought to be



unemployed. He brags very loudly about his exploits and those of his fellow nazis. His high-pitched squeak has caused much mirth among anti-fascists who are also wondering why his nickname is 'Floppy'. He has been seen drinking in Drighlington regularly by eagle-eyed 'Attitude' readers. It is rumoured that the police are taking an active interest in his thuggish activities.

Dave Franks lives in the Cobdens in Wortley. He is another long-time BNP activist who has, until now, managed to lurk in the background. Franks has been spotted regularly drinking in the Three Legs. He often carries weapons with him and has a habit of brandishing them at the wrong time in very public places. He also likes to



mouth off in the pub and often carries a crowbar which helped Leeds AFA to recognise him.

Jez Oakley from Dewsbury appeared in Attitude before. Jez is close associate of nazi thug Dave Appleyard and likes to



try and hit people with a snooker ball in a sock. He has been a regular attender at numerous fascist gatherings for several years and is often seen in Leeds staggering about under the influence of certain solvents.

Steve Roach of Recreatio Mount Holbeck. has been present at a number of occasion when people have been



Leeds City Centre. He frequents the Three Legs and Lloyd's Arms with other nazi drinkers. A former 'red', he is now a committed nazi sympathiser, although he seems reluctant to get involved in violence. His girlfriend is a 'goth' who works for the DSS at Quarry House. This is deeply worrying, as it gives her access to confidential information on anti-racists, trade unionists, Black, Jewish and Asian people which could be used to compile hit lists.

Stephen Crabtree has been deeply involved with fascist groups since the 1980's when was Batley Organise for the NF.



A regular paperseller in the past he still turns out with the BNP occasionally and is very vocal in his 'red-hating' and racism. His brother was ironically a committed left-wing activist, who had no time for Crabtree's nazi ideals.

Sid Carthew from Granville St. Elland has the been Yorkshire Organiser of the BNP for several years now and is often wheeled out to present a



'respectable' public face. A longtime nazi, he is thought to have been previously involved with the National Socialist Movement, a hardcore nazi organisation in the 1960's. Carthew often acts as press spokesman for the BNP and has recently been making some extravagant claims about their supposed levels of recruitment. He tends, along with Mick Gibson, to play 'behind-the-scenes' role in organising party activity and is a key link with the hierarchy of the BNP and the rest of the British nazi movement.





BNP Election Failure

There were 53 far-right candidates in the May local council elections. Their average vote was a disturbingly high, 6.8% but the BNP lost their only council seat in the Isle of Dogs, Millwall ward despite the fact that Derek Beackon increased his vote.

Locally, the BNP stood 2 candidates in Calderdale, West Yorkshire. Robert Mitchell of Illingworth Road, Halifax contested the Illingworth Ward while Christian (Chris) Michael Jackson, of Weir Street, Slade contested the Todmorden ward (see photo right). Mitchell, aged 37, works at Atkinson Dying Company in Keighley where he is thought to be a member of the AEU trade union. He has never stood in an election for the BNP before and was singularly unimpressive in interviews with the local press - he didn't know what a manifesto was, for example, when asked what his policies were! Most of the assenters on his nomination papers were either friends or neighbours and his election agent was Richard Mulhall of Rugby Avenue, Ovenden, Halifax.

The Todmorden candidate, Chris Jackson is aged 26 and has a history of involvement in fascist groups. He is a keen supporter of the nazi music organisation. Blood & Honour and is rumoured to be responsible for the compilation of nazi hit lists in Lancashire, in conjunction with his close crony Ken Henderson (the BNP North-west organiser). Jackson works as a fitter for Warman International Ltd. in Halifax and is a member of the AUEW trade union.

During the election campaign, the BNP did very little apart from some minor local leafleting and one papersale in Todmorden. Leeds AFA

and other groups also mobilised large numbers of anti-fascists.

On election night the BNP managed only a meagre turn out of about 10 supporters, including Tony White, Sid Carthew, Peter Dolan, Kevin Harrison and Richard Mulhall but the candidates themselves did not actually turn up for their own count. The nazis were vastly outnumbered by anti-fascists and scuttled out even before hearing the results. In the event, Jackson received 158 votes (3.8%) while Mitchell got 181 votes

In Hull, the NF candidate was Michael Cooper of Milne Rd, Bilton Grange, who stood in the Ings ward. After the common complaint that Cooper had tricked people into signing his nomination papers, his campaign was non-existent. He received 103 votes, (3.6%).

The fascist candidates in the Yorkshire area received less than the leafleting national average for the far-right and their campaigns were lacklustre at best. The BNP could not find a candidate in Leeds, Bradford or Dewsbury because their activists in those areas are more interested in drunken thuggery than electoral battles and were afraid of their inevitable public exposure by AFA. Anti-fascists should not be complacent even though the BNP lost their only seat because electoral support for the nazis is actually on the increase.

Small is Beautiful? Dave Owens, the Third Way and the BNP

Leeds AFA has been interested in the activities of The Third Way and its organiser, Dave Owens for some time. In this article we expose their members and outline their links with the BNP the UDA and the sex industry!

History of the 3rd Way

The Third Way is an offshoot of the National Front, formed in 1990 and led by one-time NF fuhrer Patrick Harrington who is distrusted among large sections of the far-right because of his links with the security services and support for Moslem fundamentalists.

The Third Way is a pseudo-intellectual group which dresses itself up in radical-sounding language in its publications, 'Third Way', 'Alternative News' and 'Northern Radical'. It claims to be interested in local communities. environmental issues and regionalism. However its real beliefs can be seen by its calls for repatriation, cultural nationalism and 'separate development of the races'. It has links with tiny obscure separatist groups in the black and Jewish community. The last issue of its magazine supported the Islamic Party of UK and condemned the BNP for their violence. This is part of their strategy to create a 'respectable' form of fascism

Leeds Third Way

Leeds is practically the only place outside London where the Third Way has a branch, or 'circle', as they prefer to call it. There are about 10 local members who meet regularly in pubs such as the Palace and Lloyd's Arms where they drink heavily and discuss tactics. Their organiser is Dave Owens (see right) but other activists are Glen Taylor, 'Chalky', Michael Shaw, Roy, Jean Trueman, Dean Taylor, Arthur Bentley and Dave Reid.

Green and Obscene

Dean Taylor is a 22-year old who was a Park Lane College student. He is a close associate of Owens and was seen with him recently scouting around Leeds University Students' Union. Dave Reid is from Northern Ireland and went to Huddersfield Poly. He runs the Third Way green front 'Greenwave' from Huddersfield and has had articles in *Third Way*. He is thought to have criminal convictions, involving violence. Leeds AFA

wonders whether these two may have had something to do with a BNP member trying to attend meetings of the Socialist Workers' Party in Huddersfield.

Arthur Bentley is a 28-year old from Bradford who was previously involved with the NF and went to school with Kevin Watmough. He makes money by selling sex aids, specialising in penis 'extensions' (see below).




It is not known whether these are sold to fellow party members - after all, the Third Way are a big fan of E.P. Schumacher's book Small is Beautiful however BNP goon Paul 'Floppy' Bennett may need his services. Bentley advertises his products in dirty magazines and has obviously not read the article in Third Way no.4 which condemns pornography. Perhaps he is just trying to fulfil the usual fascist prophecy of creating 'the new man' as opposed to the common 'half-a-man' or even 'Arthur-man' - then again maybe he is just trying to increase the size of party members!

The Ulster Connection

Though selling sex aids would be a novel way of raising party funds, the Third Way normally resort to the usual methods of selling badges and other paraphernalia to fellow fascists. In particular, they sell material from the proscribed Loyalist groups - the Ulster Defence Association and the Ulster Volunteer Force - which is bought over in Northern Ireland on their frequent visits. Dave Owens is thought to organise these trips. The contact is David Kerr, former Ulster NF organiser and Third Way candidate during the recent Euro-elections (where he received less votes than the Natural Law Party!).

Dave Owens

The political development of Dave Owens (see photo below) has been marked by a peculiar tendency to switch back and forth between key positions in different parties. Before becoming heavily involved in politics he served in an unknown capacity in the army in Northern Ireland and then worked in the 'security industry'. He was a key BNP activist in Yorkshire in the 1980's. For a while he was Yorkshire and Humberside BNP organiser and he stood as a candidate in the Richmond Hill ward in 1986. He was found guilty of distributing racist material in 1986 after sending hate mail to Councillor Neil Taggart.



At the end of the 1980's the BNP disintegrated in Leeds and lost its Northern HQ in the city. At this time Owens then joined the Third Way and left the area. He was running Greenwave from the Wirral in 1989 before moving back to Yorkshire. In 1991 he was billed as a speaker at a meeting organised by elite nazi group The League of St George in Kensington. The meeting was halted by anti-fascists who took over the venue.

Owens now lives in Victoria Avenue. Rothwell. On his return, he was appointed as Yorkshire Third Way organiser and is a member of their National Executive. He has now switched allegiance back to the BNP and was on their last papersale in Leeds. He came to support Kevin Watmough at court in May, even though Watmough hates the Third Way for being 'Jew-lovers' and Owens has been overheard calling the BNP 'a bunch of pathetic stiff right armers', The reason for this 'respectable' fascist's sudden interest in the BNP, at a time of increasing violence, remains unclear.

Bigotry, boots, machetes and morons: Yorkshire's nazis over recent months.

BNP/C18 violence and threats have continued over the past four months despite the recent establishment, according to 'Searchlight', of a specialist police unit to deal with the nazis. In recent months, attacks by nazi thugs on groups of anti-fascists have nearly always been unsuccessful. Their strategy now is to carry out random cowardly attacks on isolated individuals who are often beaten at random or for the colour of their skin. The nazis have also been trying to terrorise shops which stock material that is by black people or anti-racist. Below we catalogue some of these incidents.

March

Thurs. 11th

Acting on information provided by AFA 200 anti-fascists from AFA, YRE and ANL mobilise to prevent a BNP election meeting in Leeds. BNP supporters, such as Tony White are chased off from outside the Queens Hotel. Kevin Harrison's car is spotted twice driving by the Queens Hotel and the Metropole hotel and later stopped by the police off the Headrow after being chased by antifascists. 4 fascists including Kevin Watmough are confronted by antifascists outside the West Riding when they try to take refuge there.

Sat. 26th

Around 10 nazis attack the Socialist Workers' Party (SWP) papersale in Lands Lane, Leeds. Allegedly ... nazis present include Watmough and White. Red dye is thrown over the SWP and a paste table turned over. Kevin Watmough has since been charged with assault and affray, in connection with this incident.

April

Sat. 2nd

The SWP are attacked in Lands Lane, Leeds by 4 nazis. The attack is led by Paul 'Floppy' Bennett who hits a woman and tries to snatch papers. Dave Appleyard also apparently tries to get involved. Other nazis present include Steve Roach and Wayne Gidman. The whole attack is photographed and all

the nazis are clearly identifiable on the photos.

Sat. 16th

Anti- Nazi League (ANL) march in Leeds with about 100 anti-fascists present. Dave Appleyard is spotted scouting the march and chased off. City centre shoppers look on in horror as15 nazis charge out of the Lloyd's Arms to attack passing antifascists. The nazis are all tooled up and at least one is carrying a machete. None of the anti-fascists are injured. Nazis present include Harrison, Jason Gilbert, Appleyard, 'Sap' and 'Floppy'.

May

Sat. 14th

20-25 nazis turn up to do a paper sale in Lands Lane, Leeds (opposite the side entrance of the Schofield centre) at 12.30pm. Around half sell while the others act as security. When anti-fascists turn up to photograph them, they are immediately surrounded and threatened although no-one is hit. After trying to sell for 20 minutes the nazis then attack 25 ANL supporters outside WHSmiths. The attack is unsuccessful, as the ANL band together and fight them off, decking Watmough in the process. The police then finally arrive and are seen wandering around with a photo of Paul 'Floppy' Bennett. After the attack the nazis disperse into The Ostler's. They include: - 'Sap', Dave Franks, Stephen Crabtree, 'Floppy', White, Dave Owens, Mick Gibson, Watmough, Harrison, Richard Mulhall and Appleyard. Was that really Kevin 'Beefy' Taylor, former big cheese in Leeds NF in the 1980's, hanging out with the nazis?

Mon 16th

White, Franks and Owens turn up at court to support Watmough, at his first court appearance. Franks threatens people in the magistrates court waiting room with a crowbar inside a plastic bag. The nazis are followed from outside the court by anti-fascists and the other three abandon Watmough in his solicitor's office. The nazis are videoed and photographed by anti-fascists.

Wed. 18th

Nail Records has its front windows smashed again. 'Floppy' and White had been in there on the previous Saturday. An eye-witness who contacted Leeds AFA saw a white car leaving the scene at speed. This could be Kevin Harrison's car.

June

Sat. 4th

10-15 BNP do a papersale in Morley. Around 4pm a group of about 8 nazis are present as a student is attacked near Charles Morris Hall. The student requires hospital treatment and the attack is reported to the police. The nazis are armed with pool cues, bricks and sticks and also try smashing their way into the hall. Leeds AFA managed to contact several witnesses to the assault and show them photographs from our files. They identified Floppy and Harrison as the leaders of the assault. Also present, though not involved in the assault were Appleyard and White. An elderly West Indian man was spat on and attacked in the same area. The attack on the student was reported to the police who are investigating the incident.

Thurs. 9th

Watmough is in the magistrates' court again. Also present are White, Appleyard, Floppy and several others. Jumbo Records are also threatened on the same day by Watmough and others for displaying anti-racist merchandise and selling music by black artists. A black member of staff is racially abused.

Sat. 11th

An Asian man was reportedly attacked near The Ostler's pub. Staff at *Crash Records* were threatened for displaying anti-nazi material by Floppy, Harrison and several others.

Sat. 25th

Nail Records is attacked again and has its front window smashed for the third time. The nazis later phone the shop and threaten to burn it down.

Power in a Union...

Trades Unions have a unique responsibility in the fight against fascism as they represent ALL workers. Fascists meanwhile seek to exploit the differences between workers and so to undermine the activities of trades unions.

Throughout their history, fascist organisations have threatened the activities and even the existence of Trades Unions. Depending on the political climate, Fascists have either attempted to infiltrate unions and disrupt legitimate disputes, or they have called for their outright destruction.

Use and Abuse In the 1920's and 1930's some

elements of the German Nazi party wished to recruit trades union members but the cynical reality of this was exposed when they came to power. Hitler declared May Day 1933 a national holiday, promising that workers and the Unions had nothing to fear from the new Nazi government. The next day, stormtroopers occupied Union officials. Their negotiating and

strike rights were removed and

trades union activists were

among the first people sent to the


concentration camps.

In Italy, Mussolini's Fascist Combat squads viciously attacked trades unionists, socialists and their offices in a reign of terror in the 1920's, at the same time as Mussolini was making overtures to parliamentary 'socialists'.

This two faced approach of use and then abuse, was adopted closer to home by the National Front in the 1970s and 80s. Their racist intervention in the Imperial Typewriters dispute in 1974 split the workforce (which had a substantial Asian contingent) and meant that the bosses won. The NF actually sided with white strikebreakers, revealing that their priorities were 'racial supremacy' rather than concern for the working-class.

In the North East in the 90s, the BNP turned up at the threatened Vane Tempest pit to peddle their filth and claimed to be acting in miners' interests. Not to be taken in, miners from the local community quickly sent them packing and joined forces with local anti-fascist groups. The true nature of the BNP 'support' for the miners was revealed when BNP members attacked trades unionists and kicked over their collection bucket, the following week.



Anti-Fascists Uniting with Trades Unionists

While the NF and the BNP pretend to support workers' struggles, their true attitudes can't help but surface. In 1978, John Tyndall (now BNP Fuhrer) outlined the fate of Trades Unionists: "When we take over the reigns of power, those mobsters [pickets and strikers] will find themselves in police cells so quickly they won't know what hit them".

In the 1990's, BNP and C18 thugs

have continued their attempts to terrorise trades unions and prevent them organising. Nazis attacked the Mayday rally in Newcastle in 1992 stabbing a trades unionist. NALGO offices in London have been attacked by C18 and a UNISON official in Scarborough was subjected to a systematic campaign of intimidation by Dave Appleyard and other nazi goons. Individual trades union members have also appeared on C18 hitlists across the country, including a number from Leeds and Bradford. They often then receive telephone threats, have their houses and family attacked and are physically assaulted.

Unions And The Fightback

While the Trades Union movement has long been involved in the antifascist struggle, it also has a significant part to play in the wider struggle for rights and representation by ethnic minority workers. Many recent immigrants to the UK work in under-paid and under-unionised jobs and have been exploited by employers to keep profits high. The fascists' propaganda exploits real fears of joblessness with lies that immigration causes unemployment. Both trades unionists and antifascists must reveal the reality behind the nazi claims and actively mobilise people to prevent them spreading their race-hate.

Fascism's anti-democratic assaults on the Labour movement and the working-class have been resisted by trades unionists in Britain since the 1930's. In 1936 thousands of trades unionists in London joined forces with anti-fascists to defeat Moslev's blackshirts at the Battle of Cable Street. Trades Unions also sent many volunteers to fight fascism in Spain, as part of the International Brigade. More recently, grassroots trades unionists were involved with the original Anti-Nazi League in the 1970's and have organised on the streets with AFA and other groups such as Tyne and Wear Anti-Fascist Association (TWAFA) and Notts Anti-Fascist Alliance in the 1980's and 1990's.

Organising in the Workplace

Trades Unions also have a crucial role because of their unique organisation in the workplace. Fascists who are members of trades unions or work where they are privy to sensitive information on antiracists or black, Jewish and Asian people must be exposed and should be expelled. In the last few years, trades unionists have been at the forefront of struggles to get fascist civil servants sacked.

Members of the CPSA successfully campaigned to get Kathy Murphy a member of the Aryan Resistance Resistance Movement and Blood & Honour sacked from her job in the DSS office in Coventry. This was an excellent example of trades unionists working effectively with local anti-fascists and using intelligence (provided Searchlight).

Other campaigns have resulted in trades unionists being victimised by their employers for their anti-fascist stance. For example, Simon Chadwick a BNP/C18 thug, was also sacked from his job in the Department of Employment in Sheffield after protests from the CPSA. Some of the trades unionists who organised in Sheffield were later demoted and others received written warnings.

The recent TUC demonstration in east London on March 19th was supported by over 50,000 people and was a positive step in mobilising the massed ranks of the trades union movement against the BNP. The TUC worked closely with wellestablished local black, anti-racist and anti-fascist groups to build for the march.

Anti-fascist initiatives uniting the trades unions, anti-fascists and the wider community like this should be developed across the country wherever fascists try to organise. In Leeds, AFA has a long pedigree with the trade union movement (see article right) and has had repeated success against the fascists. Now more than ever, the trade unions have a vital part to play in stopping the nazis in West Yorkshire.

Leeds AFA & Trade Unions

Leeds is a city with a proud trades union and anti-fascist tradition. In the 1930's hundreds of working-class people from Leeds joined the International Brigade and many died fighting Franco's fascists. In the late 1940's, anti-fascist organisations The 43 Group and the Association of Jewish ex-servicemen and Women (AJEX) had active branches in Leeds.

Leeds AFA has always recognised the importance of trade union involvement in the anti-fascist struggle and has been actively supported from our inception by the trades union movement. In 1987 Leeds AFA was launched and produced a report with the Leeds Trades Union Council on nazi activity, Racism & Fascism in Leeds & West Yorks: Twenty stop the fascists. If you are a Years of Violence and Intimidation.

In 1988 Leeds AFA and Leeds trades union council produced another report Terror on our Terraces: The National Front, Football Violence and Leeds United which was extremely wellreceived. Soon after, AFA and local trades unions helped launch the hugely successful Leeds Fans United Against Racism and campaign which won the Supporters' Football Association 'Services to Soccer Award' in 1988 and continues to this day.

More recently, AFA has this close maintained contact. AFA mobilised members to leaflet for the TUC anti-racist march and our specialist knowledge of PAGE). nazi activity in Yorkshire means that we are regularly invited to speak to T.Ú. meetings.

Leeds AFA supported trades unionists have suffered harassment and have often managed to identify the nazis responsible.

In Yorkshire, the two BNP candidates in the May Council Elections are both thought to be members of trades unions. Kevin Harrison, Leeds BNP minifuhrer was also a member of the GPMU.

Leeds AFA acts as a source of information on racists and fascists and their activities. This information is available to trade unionists and other groups threatened by their activities.
